Hints from the Fog

Rick Mason –is our Vice President and leads the Product Evaluation team. He still works for GM and has successfully launched his own inventions following our training to a “T”. He has also launched a “kickstarter” process on new product and documented and shown the ICMM Members the exact costs and steps it takes to actually do the total process. Rick agreed to take this on as Marty Sovis and Mike Ball did for the Amazon sales of their products and shared all the hidden costs and frustrations with our ICMM members.

Marty Sovis - Marty is our Secretary/Treasurer and also sits on the Product Review Team. Marty, like Mike Ball, used to lead the Review team, but was too much with his business and other work he does. Marty is also on the E-Team for Genesee County along with Mike Ball and interfaces with Mott Fab Lab and the Veterans affairs. Marty is really the leader of the club and has been instrumental in writing our procedures and handling our bank and payment system. He and Mike Ball established the two signature system on any expenditure that requires ICMM Funds. We have check and balances on everything all the way to Board or Directors of membership approval.

ICMM direction and discipline.

We now have all our own equipment for our meetings. Projectors, sound system, Skype, laptop, White Board, Markers, microphones, internet access, etc. All of our equipment is owned by ICMM and cared for by board members. ICMM is full voluntary club with no one being paid. We pay the expense we approve, like Jump Start, printing, signs, etc. We have operated in the black for the last four years. We account for every penny.

We are focused on the invention process of design, engineering, manufacturing, and distribution. We do not try to sell our members products, they do that, we only support and advise them. We share all of our experience with members so they do not have to relearn everything again. We probably have the best sharing and networking of any club we have seen.

Mike Ball is our president and will be 70 years old on his next birthday. His background includes being a tradesman, engineer, inventor, businessman, soldier, magician, mechanic, and many other jobs. It is hard to trick an old dog and he does not tolerate fools lightly. He will ask where is the data, design, drawing, mock-up, prototype, packaging, and other real things. It is easy to be a critic, but not a cook. We review, not imagine things.

Our club has many tradesmen (current and retired) with many practical skills. We know the process and don't lead people on, if they are wrong. We do not make judgments on the success of an invention, only on the actual list in the Product process. Have you done the research, idea development, design, engineering, testing, marketing, packaging, administration, and a manufacturing formula to make certain the invention (product) will be profitable before you try to produce it? The difference between an invention and a product is doing all the calculations before you produce anything to make sure it will make money if you sell the product. An invention is not a business unless it produces cash flow.

We have been told that our methods are too hard. We say that losing money is easy, but making money is hard. Why produce something if it loses money?

We do not tell people what they want to hear, we tell them what they need to hear, The TRUTH. We do not trust opinions only cold hard proven facts. We have been told that other clubs do not have the skill sets to operate this way, but we think they do. It takes a lot more work, instead of looking for only ideas, someone in a club can go sell and make money on from an inventor's idea.

ICMM may not be large but we are honest and accountable for what we teach others. We will stay the course and stick to simple processes that work.
