A Self-Examination: Inventor or Dreamer?

What is an inventor? My definition of an inventor is someone who sees a problem and creates a usable or improved solution to that problem. Notice that I did not say a sellable, profitable, or patentable solution to the problem.

Ideas come to everyone. Taking action to create and demonstrate a solution to the problem are done by very few. Inventors want to change the world, or at least improve the solutions in it.

The first utility (full) patent was issued in 1836 and was the only one issued that year. As of June 2007 there have been 7,155,746 issued according to the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO).

Many of these patents are issued to employees of large corporations which is a standard filing practice by many corporate engineering groups.

It has been estimated that fewer than 5% of all patents awarded actually make a profit.

Those are long odds, but this figure demonstrates that being issued a patent is no guarantee of success.

Ask yourself some of these questions.

- Would you rather watch television than read? If the answer is yes, you will not make a good inventor.
- Have you ever written a poem, a book, a story or other creative work? If the answer is yes, you have demonstrated some traits an inventor needs.
- Have you ever sketched an idea on a piece of paper? If yes, you probably have the skills to be an inventor
- Do you work until an assignment is completed correctly? If yes, then you have the “stick-to-it-ness” of an inventor.
- Do you like to create things with your hands? If yes, you definitely can be an inventor.
- Do you give up easily? If yes, you should not try to be an inventor.
- Do you hate negative feedback? If yes, you will be a poor inventor.
- Can you follow a written process? If yes, then you can succeed as an inventor.
- Are you afraid of taking risks? If yes, you do not want to be an inventor.
- Are you willing to risk your time and money on an idea? If the answer is no, you should not become an inventor.

I don't want to be too hard on the reader, just realistic. Almost anyone that is willing to work can be a successful inventor. But not everyone can be a successful business person.

Inventors enjoy the challenge of creating solutions and solving problems. They may need to partner with someone that enjoys marketing, selling, promoting, etc. Work to your strengths not your weaknesses. You should network with others to fill in the gaps in your skill sets.
